North Carolina Bible Institute Administrative Policies

What We Believe

We are a fundamental, evangelical, Bible-believing school based upon canonized Old Testament and New Testament scripture as the inerrant and infallible Word of God. We accept that the Bible is God's instruction manual for life, and it is not open to any single or denominational interpretation but is written to all mankind.

It is our belief that God created the earth and the universe in six literal days and that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, born of a virgin. We believe that Jesus died on the cross at Calvary, arose from the dead three days later, and now sits at the right hand of God as our High Priest. We believe that those who have been born-again through the blood of Jesus Christ will reign in Heaven for eternity. Finally, we believe that non-believers will be sentenced to a burning hell for all eternity.

All students must be a working part of a local church. Time spent in participation within the local church will be logged and turned in to the North Carolina Bible Institute. These hours are figured into the student's semester credit hours as personal ministry. God's Word demands that we be doers of the Word and not hearers (or students) only.

Application Fee and Tuition

A non-refundable application fee of \$60.00 must accompany all applications. Please note that NO textbooks will be released without pre-payment! Remaining balance of tuition and other applicable fees MUST be paid in full by April 15th of each school year.

Transferred Credits

The North Carolina Bible Institute reserves the right to allow, or not to allow, credits earned at other institutions for similar courses taken at that institution. If credit is awarded, the candidate will be assessed \$2.00 per credit hour. These hours may not exceed 60% of the required hours for graduation from the North Carolina Bible Institute.

Refund Policy

Students may change or drop a program at any time during the first week after notification of their acceptance into the North Carolina Bible Institute. When a program is dropped or withdrawn from and no substitute is taken, a 10% refund will be made, upon request. No refunds are given for Book Fees. A student must notify the North Carolina Bible Institute in writing of the intention to withdraw or drop a program. NO REFUNDS ON DOCTORAL PROGRAMS.

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Policy

Purpose

To ensure all students are making adequate academic progress toward completing their educational program in a timely manner and maintaining eligibility for enrollment and financial aid, if applicable.

Policy Statement

All students enrolled in a degree or certificate program must maintain **Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)**. This includes meeting both **quantitative (pace of completion)** and **qualitative (GPA)** standards as defined below:

1. Qualitative Standard (GPA Requirement):

- Students must maintain a minimum cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale) at the end of each academic term.
- Specific programs may have higher GPA requirements. Students should consult their program handbook.

2. Quantitative Standard (Pace of Completion):

- Students must successfully complete at least 67% of all attempted credit hours.
- Grades of **F**, **W**, **I**, **and NP** are considered attempted but not completed.

3. Maximum Time Frame:

- Students must complete their program within 150% of the published program length.
 - □ Example: A 60-credit program must be completed within 90 attempted credits.

4. SAP Evaluation and Notification:

- SAP is evaluated at the **end of each academic term** (fall, spring, and summer).
- Students who do not meet SAP will be notified via email and/or written letter

5. SAP Statuses:

- Good Standing: Student meets all SAP standards.
- Warning: Student fails to meet SAP for the first time; eligible to enroll and receive financial aid for one term.
- Suspension: Student fails to meet SAP after a warning term; ineligible for financial aid and may face academic restrictions.
- **Probation:** Student who successfully appeals a suspension; eligible to enroll and receive aid while on an academic plan.

6. Appeal Process:

Students may appeal a SAP suspension by submitting a written appeal with:

- Explanation of circumstances (e.g., illness, family emergency).
- What has changed to allow for future success.
- · Academic plan developed with an advisor.

Appeals must be submitted by the deadline for each term as listed on the institution's website or academic calendar.

7. Reinstatement:

Students regain eligibility once they meet SAP standards again or successfully complete the requirements of an approved academic plan.

North Carolina Bible Institute Accreditation

If the sole purpose of needing an education is for the Gospel ministry or related field within Christian ministry, secular accreditation is not necessary or required. All Christian churches accept quality Christian education regardless to which accreditation group, if any, the referenced institution belongs. If study is for purpose other than ministry, such as business administrator, engineer, lawyer, etc., students should apply to an institution that belongs to a regional accrediting association. In secular education, regional accreditation is essential! For education of those in Christian service, secular accreditation does little more than typically make the tuition beyond the reach of most ministers.

VERY IMPORTANT

Programs of study offered by North Carolina Bible Institute have been declared by the appropriate state authority exempt from the requirements for licensure, under provisions of North Carolina General Statutes (G.S.) 116-15 (d) for exemption from licensure with respect to religious education. Exemption from licensure is not based upon assessment of program quality under established licensing standards.

Credit Hours

A 3-credit-hour college course reflects the total amount of time a student is expected to invest in learning, both in and out of class. Here's a standard breakdown based on the **Carnegie Unit** system, used in U.S. higher education:

North Carolina College of Theology General Information

Statement of Purpose

North Carolina College of Theology was founded in 2001 by the late, Dr. J. L. Cook. The college started in China Grove, NC with 9 students. Dr..Cook's purpose was to educate men and women of God that did not have the means or resources to attend college. In 2003 after the institution had grown considerable, Dr. Cook moved the college to Wilmington, NC. Under his leadership the college grew to students in 39 states and 112 countries. After his death in 2013, the college has continued to flourish under the leadership of Dr. Judy Cook and Dr. Timothy Cook.

NCCT, as a biblically based, evangelical community, is dedicated to the preparation of men and women for Christ-like servant-hood and leadership in the church, the marketplace and the world. The institution strives to raise up spiritual leaders to hear the voice of God, to communicate the Gospel with vitality, to lead with authority, to minister with compassion, to convey the resurrection power of hope with conviction.

NCCT's purpose can be summed up in one phrase: "Reach the World for Jesus, one student at a time". By fulfilling this one statement, we can have a huge impact on the church, marketplace and the world.

NCCT believes there is only one God that created the heavens and the earth. The divine God-head consist of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. We believe in the virgin birth of Jesus, who came to earth to save humans from their sins. 

- Three letters of recommendation (at least one academic and one pastoral).
- Personal interview with program director or admissions committee.

- A minimum of 60 semester credit hours beyond the master's degree.
- Completion of all required core courses, electives, and dissertation.
- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.

Each candidate must complete and defend a doctoral dissertation that demonstrates original research in the field of eschatology. The dissertation must be approved by the doctoral committee and successfully defended in an oral examination.




